

Peter Monsen or Mogensen was born April 8, 1830 in Svenstrup, Lngland, Denmark. He married Ane Kerstine Christensen on April 2, 1863 in Salt Lake City. He died on February 9, 1924 in Mt. Pleasant, Utah.

Ane Kerstine Christensen was born on October 8, 1848 in Copenhagen, Denmark. She died on April 9, 1888 in Mt. Pleasant, Utah. She had thirteen children.

Peter joined the church in Denmark as a young man, and was baptized March 9, 1853. He presided over the conference as Mission President for sometime after becoming a member. On November 29, 1855, he and his first wife, Dorothea set sail from England to America in a sailing vessel. There were 508 People on the ship and 437 were Scandinavians. On June 26, 1856, they began their journey across the plains to Salt Lake City. There were 60 wagons with two yoke of oxen to each wagon. In 1858 they were called to Sanpete to settle. They went to Ephraim, but moved to Mt. Pleasant in 1859. He married his second wife, Ane Kerstine Christensen in 1863.

Daniel Jeppeson Beckstrom was born Jan 10, 1835 in Billinge, Sweden. He married Sarah Betty Longberg on June 23, 1861 in Billinge, Sweden. They came to America for the Gospel's sake. Eight children were born to them, but five died before reaching maturity. Daniel was the first carpenter in Mt. Pleasant. He served as a missionary in his native land. He visited the home of Sarah Betty Longberg and converted both her and her mother. They all three immigrated together to Zion, where they located in Mt. Pleasant.

Daniel died on October 29, 1902 in Spring City, Utah. Sarah Betty died on September 20, 1920, in Mt. Pleasant, Utah.
