Kyle tells me of a time when he and the other young men from Castle Dale second ward went fishing at Straight Canyon. They spent the whole day out fishing the other men catching thirty-four fish. All the other young man wondered how he could catch so many fish in such little time.

Kyle replied that you have to do two out of three things: First turn your hat backwards; next, keep your worms warm. The third is always an optional thing. You have to wait for the fish to bite the hook.

Kyle believes that having you hat backward will bring even the unluckiest person some luck. He also believes that having your worms warm will keep them more active and he fish at interest. Kyle feels the main point of fishing is to have patience while fishing.

Kyle says that after he told his secret to everyone they all turned their hats around backwards, made sure that their worms were warm and left their poles and line in the water for more than five minutes.

Kyle says that there is one more way to insure that you will catch a great number of fish. He feels that talking to the fish make them want to take his hook.

Before leaving Straight Canyon and the fish that he and the other young men caught the young men decided that it was time for them to home, because they were sick of Kyle catching all

of the fish.
