

DANIEL ABRAHAM JOHNSON

Daniel Abraham Johnson was born 13 April 1871 in Fountain Green, Sanpete County Utah to Peter Johnson and Margaret Ann Hansen. He moved to Cleveland, Emery County Utah with his family while a young boy. They moved to a home in the center of town. Daniel was known by his family and friends as Dan. He belonged to a musically talented family. He played the violin. He and his family were active in the Church and community.

When he was about 36 he was called to serve a mission to the Northern States. He received an honorable release 18 March 1909. When he returned home he courted Carrie Christina Mortensen. They were married 7 April 1910 in the Salt Lake Temple. They settled in Cleveland and purchased a home in the center of town near his mother's home. He also purchased a farm east of town. Dan farmed for a living for many years, as long as his health would permit.

Dan and Carrie had a family of nine children; 5 girls and 4 boys. Their first daughter, Carrie, lived for 3 days. The other children lived to maturity. They were: Austin Daniel, Orvil Cyril, Thelma, Lenore, Odessa, Horace Dean, Dora and Clayton Levi. Five children are still living (1985)

Dan and Carrie and family were active in the Church. Dan held many Church positions; Home teacher, Sunday School Superintendent, plus others. He was ward clerk for 32 years. He was also register of vital statistics for many years and secretary of the Cleveland Canal Company.

Dan had many friends, a sense of humor and was always concerned for others. He was a good husband and father. Dan and Carrie lived in the same house in Cleveland all their married life. Daniel Abraham died in the Price hospital 21 January 1950. Carrie died at the home of a daughter, Odessa and Clell Jones, in Cleveland 19 December 1951. They are both buried in the Cleveland City cemetery.
