GRUMP-MY SISTER LERUSE IS SHE'S DEAD, UM SHE WAS BORN IN ABOUT 1922 AND THEN DORDINE WAS BORN IN ABOUT 19...27, THEN I WAS BORN AND HAD A TWIN SISTER IN 1929, MY BROTHER JIM CAME 7 YEARS AFTER THAT, HE HAD A TWIN BROTHER THAT DIED, AND THEN EARL WAS BORN IN 1946.

KODIE-AND DID YOUR TWIN SISTER DIE OR IS SHE STILL ALIVE?

GRUMP-OH SHE DIED.

KODIE- WERE YOU ALL BORN IN FERRON?

GRUMP-NO LERUSE WAS BORN IN PRICE AND THE REST OF US WAS BORN IN FERRON.

KODIE-UM...WHAT IS YOUR DADS FULL NAME?

GRUMP-BRYANT ANDREW NELSON.

KODIE-AND WHERE WAS HE BORN?

GRUMP-FERRON, UTAH.

KODIE- WHAT KIND OF GAMES DID YOU PLAY WHEN YOU WERE YOUNGER?

GRUMP-OH RUN MY SHEEPY RUN!

KODIE-SO YOU BASICALLY JUST FARMED?

GRUMP-YA, WELL NO.

KODIE-WAS IT A GAME?

GRUMP-YA, RUN MY SHEEPY RUN IS A GAME KIDS PLAYED. YOU KIDS NOW DAYS DON'T KNOW VERY MUCH.

KODIE(LAUGH HA HA HA)

GRUMP-WE USED TO PLAY HIDE-N-SEEK...AT NIGHTS WE USED TO PLAY SOME KIND OF A CARD GAME I CAN'T REMEMBER WHAT IT WAS, WE USED TO PLAY COWBOYS-N-INDIANS, THAT IS ABOUT IT. KODIE-WHAT GAME WAS YOUR FAVORITE? GRUMP-RUN MY SHEEPY RUN!

GRAM-DO YOU WANT MY AMERICAN NAME? OR MY  
DUTCH NAME?

KODIE-BOTH.

GRAM-WOUTJE BOUKJE JETSKJE KOOPMANS NELSON,  
AND I JUST GO BY BECKY J NELSON.

KODIE-AND WHAT ARE YOUR NICKNAMES

GRAM- GRAM BELLE, OH GRAM, I DON'T KNOW

KODIE-AND HOW DID YOU GET IT?

GRAM- THE GRAND-KIDS GAVE ME THE NAME

KODIE- WHO ALL CALLS YOU BY YOUR NICK NAME?

GRAM- THE GRAND-KIDS!

KODIE- AND WHERE DO YOU LIVE?

GRAM- IN CLAWSON, UTAH.

KODIE-HAVE YOU EVER LIVED ANYWHERE ELSE?

GRAM-OH YES, I HAVE.

KODIE-AND DO YOU WANNA TELL ME THE WHERE AND  
WHEN?

GRAM- OK 1962, I MARRIED AND LEFT AND WENT TO  
TUSAN, ARIZONA, LIVED THEIR FOR TWO YEARS. AND  
THEN I MOVED AN WENT TO SPOKAN, WASHINGTON  
AND LIVED THERE FOR TWO YEARS. AND THEN I  
BRIEFLY LIVED IN AH SALT LAKE THEN WENT TO

CALIFORNIA, LIVED IN NORTHERN AND SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA. AND WENT TO ALASKA AND KODIE-WHEN DID YOU LIVE THERE?  
GRAM-OH LETS SEE.... I'M NOT CERTAIN. SHE MIGHT HAVE BEEN FIVE YEARS OLD OR SOMETHING, I ONLY LIVED THERE ABOUT 4 MONTHS BECAUSE I DIDN'T FEEL LIKE I WAS IN THE SAME COUNTRY... SO I WANTED TO MOVE BACK WHERE I WAS... LAS VEGAS, NEVADA. AND.. SALT LAKE, AND AH NOW WE MOVED TO CLAWSON.

GRAM-OK SEPTEMBER 18, 1955, MARILYN AND

CAROLYN CURTIS, I GUESS THAT IS WHAT THEY WENT  
BY I DON'T KNOW AUGUST 28, 1956, GLENA NELSON  
AUGUST 21, 1957, AND SHERI NELSON SEPTEMBER 23,  
1959, TRACY NELSON MAY 4, 1961, AND DEANNI  
DEHAAN MAY 12, 1964, LEE DEHAAN JUNE 27, 1967,  
SHELIA NELSON MAY 16, 1967, TIFFANY NELSON

DECEMBER 21, 1973, BRYANT NELSON NOVEMBER 18,  
1975, JAMIE NELSON JANUARY 8, 1976, LISA NELSON

EVER HAD?

GRAM-I WAS A CANDY GIRL IN A THEATER.

KODIE WHAT DID YOU DO?

GRAM-I SOLD POPCORN AND CANDY AND DRINKS AND  
THEN I GOT TO BE THE HEAD OF ALL OF THE CANDY  
GIRLS. SO I GOT TO DO ALL OF THEIR SCHEDULING,  
TOOK CARE OF ORDERING ALL OF THE CANDY, DID  
ALL OF THE BOOK WORK, THE MONEY AND  
SOMETIMES I WOULD SELL TICKETS, BUT NOT VERY  
OFTEN I WAS PRETTY MUCH IN THE CANDY  
DEPARTMENT.

KODIE- AND WHAT OTHER JOBS HAVE YOU HAD?

GRAM-AND I WAS 16 YEARS OLD. OH MY GOODNESS  
I'VE HAD LOTS OF JOBS. LETS SEE, YA I WORKED IN A  
VERY EXPENSIVE DEPARTMENT STORE IN THE LINEN  
DEPARTMENT, AND THEN WE HAD TO WEAR HIGH  
HEELS EVERY DAY AND YOU COULD ONLY DRESS IN  
EITHER BLACK OR WHITE OR NAVY BLUE, YOU HAD

TO WEAR HIGH HEALS AND NYLONS EVERY DAY, AND THEN I WORKED IN A LITTLE DRESS SHOP, AND I WAS THE CASHIER THERE, AND THEN I WORKED IN A DRUG STORE FOR A WHILE, AND.... I SOLD AVON ABOUT 3 TIMES IN DIFFERENT PLACES.

GRAM- AND LETS SEE, OH I WAS A SECRETARY TEMP UP IN SPOKAN , AND OH I WAS AN, WORKED IN AN INSURANCE OFFICE AS A SECRETARY, FOR SEVERAL YEARS, AND THEN I WORKED AS THE TOWN CLERK FOR THE TOWN OF CLAWSON FOR 2 YEARS, AND THEN I WORKED NOW AM WORKING IN TIFFANY SORENSEN'S AFFORDABLE FLOORING. STORE, AS THE MANAGER  
KODIE-AND BACK IN THE DAY  
GRAM-BACK IN THE DAY

KODIE-HOW MUCH MONEY DID YOU MAKE AN HOUR?  
DO YOU REMEMBER?

GRAM-I DON'T, I KNOW WHEN I WAS OH, WORKING AT A THE INSURANCE OFFICE AT STATE FARM, IN SALT LAKE I MADE ABOUT \$350 A MONTH AND WAS RAISING 3, 2 KIDS, 2 KIDS ON THAT.

KODIE-AND HOW MUCH AN HOUR?

GRAM-AND AND AND I DON'T KNOW IT WAS LIKE \$350  
A MONTH WORKING EVERYDAY  
KODIE-OH NOT GOOD.  
GRAM-SO YA KNOW THAT WAS WAGES IN THOSE DAYS.  
KODIE-AND HOW MUCH SCHOOLING HAVE YOU HAD?  
GRAM- I FINISHED HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATED FROM  
EME...EAST HIGH SCHOOL IN SALT LAKE CITY, AND  
THAT'S ALL.  
KODIE-NO COLLEGE?  
GRAM -NO  
KODIE-ARE YOU A MEMBER OF CLUBS,  
ORGANIZATIONS OR CHURCHES?  
GRAM-I BELONG TO THE CHURCH OF JESUS CHRIST  
OF LATTER DAY SAINTS. SHOULD I SING THE SONG?  
KODIE-NO, IF YOU WANT TO ?  
GRAM-AND I BELONG TO THE RELIEF SOCIETY  
ORGANIZATION, I DID BELONG TO SOME CLUBS AT  
SCHOOL WHEN I WAS IN HIGH SCHOOL. I DON'T  
RECALL ALL OF EM, BUT I DID SING IN THE CHOIR,  
CHORUS WHAT EVER YOU WANNA CALL IT. AND I DID  
PLAY A VIOLIN FOR A YEAR, I DID PLAY A CELLO FOR  
A YEAR, AND I PLAY THE PIANO AND I ONLY GOT  
ABOUT 2 SCHOOL YEARS THAT WOULD BE LIKE THE 9

MONTHS THAT SCHOOL IS ON OF TRAINING ON THE PIANO. SO NOW I PLAY FOR THE RELIEF SOCIETY AND I HAVE DONE THAT FOR A COUPLE OF YEARS. NOW. SO NOW I AM LEARNING HOW TO PLAY THE PIANO AGAIN. KODIE-AND DID, WAS THEIR LIKE A TRACK TEAM OR SOMETHING OR ANYTHING FOR YOU TO DO BACK IN THE DAY?

GRAM-WE DIDN'T HAVE NO SWIM TEAMS UM I LIKED TO PLAY BASKET BALL AND THEN I BROKE MY ANKLE PLAYING BASKET BALL IN HIGH SCHOOL

KODIE-WERE YOU ON THE TEAM?

GRAM-UM

KODIE- OR JUST PLAYED FOR FUN?

GRAM-NAAAAA, I REMEMBER PLAYING AGAINST

ANOTHER TEAM BUT I DON'T YA KNOW IT IS HARD TO REMEMBER BACK, I ALSO DANCED WE DID MODERN DANCE I WAS IN THAT, AND I LOVED ALL KINDS OF SPORTS GROWING UP. BECAUSE I ALWAYS WANTED TO BEAT EVERY BOY THERE EVER WAS, AND I DID. IN BASEBALL AND BASKET BALL AND RUNNING ANYTHING ELSE I WAS BETTER THAN THE REST OF THE BOYS.

KODIE-AND DO YOU HAVE ANY OTHER BROTHERS  
AND SISTERS?

GRAM- I HAVE ONE BROTHER AND HIS NAME IS LEO  
CARL NO THAT IS MY DAD LEO CARL, MY BROTHER IS  
LEO WHIM KOOPMANS BORN AUGUST 10 1942.

KODIE-AND UM WHERE WAS HE BORN?

GRAM- HE WAS BORN IN THE NETHERLANDS ALSO  
SAME PLACE AS I WAS BORN, AND HIS NAME IN DUTCH  
IS LEO WHIM KOOPMANS (WITH A DUTCH ACCENT).

KODIE-AND WHAT IS YOUR FATHERS FULL NAME?  
IN DUTCH?

GRAM-IT WAS IN DUTCH LOLKA CLAS KOOPMANS AND  
IN AMERICAN HE HAD IT CHANGED WHEN HE TOOK  
OUT HIS CITIZENSHIP IN 1955, IT WAS CHANGED TO  
LEO CARL KOOPMANS.

KODIE-AND WHERE WAS HE BORN? AND WHAT YEAR  
DO YOU KNOW?

GRAM-HE WAS BORN DECEMBER 31, AND I DON' T  
KNOW THE YEAR I THINK IT WAS 1904

KODIE-AND DO YOU KNOW WHERE HE WAS BORN IN  
THE NETHERLANDS?

GRAM-HUM I AM NOT SURE IF IT IS THE SAME PLACE  
THAT WE WERE BORN

KODIE- BUT IN THE NETHERLANDS

GRAM-I DON'T KNOW WHAT THE NAME OF IT WAS?

KODIE- AND WHAT ABOUT YOUR MOM?

GRAM-AND MY MOM WAS BORN OCTOBER 6, 1906.

ALSO IN THE NETHERLANDS. I AM NOT SURE WHERE.

KODIE-OK AND WHAT IS HER NAME?

GRAM -HER NAME IN DUTCH WAS VOTJIA RUDA

KOOPMANS, AND SHE CHANGED IT WHEN SHE GOT

HER CITIZENSHIP TO VOTJIA. SHE JUST KEPT THE  
ENDING OFF, KOOPMANS.

KODIE-K AND WHAT KINDA GAMES DID YOU PLAY  
WHEN YOU WERE YOUNGER?

GRAM- I REMEMBER PLAYING TIDDLY WINKS

KODIE-HOW DO YOU PLAY THAT?

GRAM-INFACT I REMEMBER I FOUND SOME THE

OTHER DAY, THERE, YOU HAVE A LITTLE JAR, AND IT  
HAS LITTLE ROUND PLASTIC CIRCLES, DIFFERENT  
COLORS IN IT, AND DIFFERENT SIZES, AND YOU JUST  
THROW EM ALL OUT AND YOU TAKE THE BIGGEST ONE  
AND TRY AND FLIP THE LITTLE ONES INTO THE  
LITTLE CAN. THAT'S TIDDLY WINKS. (HA HA HA)

GRAM- I REMEMBER WE USED TO DO JUMP THE ROPE  
AND UM HOPSCOTCH AND NIGHT GAMES WE PLAYED  
IN OUR NEIGHBORHOOD WITH THE BOYS. THERE WAS

THEIR PORCH, AND SHE AND I DIDN'T LIKE MY  
FRIEND NEXT DOOR NAMED PATSY LYMON, SHE WAS  
A LITTLE YOUNGER THAN ME. WE'D GO UP AND WE'D  
BE THE SALOON GIRLS, AND WE'D SING AND DANCE  
FOR THE BOYS(HA HA HA) ON THE PORCH  
KODIE-SO YOU'D BE LIKE SHOW GIRLS  
GRAM-YA

KODIE- DID YOU DANCE TO, LIKE KICK YOUR LEGS IN  
LIKE A LINE DANCE

GRAM-YA SURE!!:

(HA HA HA HA HA HA HA)

GRAM-AND THEN WE'D PLAY LIKE YA KNOW HIDE-N-  
SEEK AND THAT KIND OF NIGHT GAME STUFF,

OUTSIDE UNTIL IT GOT TO DARK THEN WE'D GO IN,  
HAD A LOT OF FUN!

KODIE- DID YOU EVER PLAY KISS TAG? OR IS THAT
