Heidi: Ok, what is your full name?

Shelly: Shelly Lynn Scow

Heidi: Um where do you live?

Shelly: Orangeville, Utah.

Heidi: Um where were you born, and when were you born?

Shelly: I was born in Columbus, Ohio. On air force base, on November 27, 1961.

Heidi: Are you married?

Shelly: Yes.

Heidi: What is you spouses name and where was he born?

Shelly: Um his name is Michael Clarence Scow; he was born in Provo, Utah.

Heidi: Ok um do you have any children?

Shelly: Um yes, I have six.

Heidi: Ok, what is their names, birth dates, and present residences?

Shelly: Um Cammie Anne Scow is my oldest daughter. She is now married and living in Logan with her husband Nick Ridge and my two granddaughters Avery and Raegan, and then Tiffany Michelle is my second daughter born November 28, 1982, her and her husband. She married Dallen Johnson, they are residing in Payson Utah, with two more granddaughters, Kaejha and Shannon, and then Kyle is my first born son, he is residing in price Utah right now attending C.E.U. college and going to be graduating this year and then also probably moving up to Logan to go to Utah state. My second son Kory Clarence Scow was born May 17, 1987 and he is also living in Price with Kyle, and where he has been going to school, and right now just working as he is preparing to turn in mission papers. My fourth daughter Heidi Lynn Scow was born April 26, 1989 and um

you know her, and then my last one is my fourth daughter Shalee Blanch Scow was born August 9, 1991.

Heidi: Ok and what kind of work do you do?

Shelly: I work at emery telecom where I am a C.S.R. basically my duties are over disconnects, programming, and billing.

Heidi: Ok, do you have any brothers or sisters?

Shelly: I have one older brother and one younger sister, my older brother Wade Gordon that lives in Idaho Falls, and a younger sister Shawna, Shawna lee who lives in Texas.

Heidi: And when are their birthdays?

Shelly: Wade was born April 7, no, excuse me April 9, 1958 and Shawna was born December 29, 1969.

Heidi: Ok, what is your father's full name?

Shelly: Um the father who raised me was, his full name was John Bruce Gordon.

Heidi: Ok and where was his birth place?

Shelly: His birth place was Park City, Utah.

Heidi: Ok, and what kind of work did he do?

Shelly: He was a coal miner, most of my life. I grew up as a coal miner's daughter.

Heidi: And what are your fondest memories of him?

Shelly: He was avid fishermen, outdoorsmen, so ah, a lot of fishing trips.

Heidi: Ok, and what is your mother's full name?

Shelly: Sharon Anne Murcley

Heidi: Ok, and what kind of work does she do?

Shelly: um I grew up with her teaching piano lessons out of our home and then um later on in life after my father past away she went back to college got her practicing nurses PA where she's been working in nursing homes as a PA um or an a RN, excuse me, and but she's currently, um on a disability because of a back problem.

Heidi: Ok, and what is your fondest memory of her?

Shelly: Um, my mom was a good mom, I have a lot of fond memories of her, I was close to her she was close to me, and um, I don't know there is just a lot of memories there.

Heidi: Ok, what do you remember about the house you grew up in?

Shelly: There were several home we grew up in, um the ones I remember, the beginning, when we lived in, when my mother got remarried we lived in a house on center street, American Fork, Utah, its probably the one I first regulate, that one has memories because I remember the adjustment I was going through from, from my mom getting remarried and the strange man being in the house, and being scared of him, and I remember waking up in the morning and I would run and hide in the bedroom, we probably lived there a couple of years, and later on moved a few blocks over in American Fork to a home that had actually been owned by my grandmother, and when my grandfather died and when she remarried she left the home to my mom and dad where we lived until he lost his job, working in a rock mine and then he went and applied and got a job down here working at the Desbey Dove mine where we moved to Ferron we lived out on Mullen road which was a big change for us we had come from American Fork which at the time was considered a big city and we moved to Ferron and even worse than Ferron was Mullen road where it was actually no one and we were the last house out there and wade and I who had been surrounded by friends all the sudden found us alone and had to learn to

rely on each other was the first time ever that we had to ride a bus to school, um we lived there only for a few months though, my parents purchased a home in Orangeville Utah, we probably lived in that home five or six years while I was in jr. high they sold it and my parents purchased the land that they put the double wider on and we moved into that when I was about in my eighth and ninth year in jr. high we lived in that until I got married and left home.

Heidi: Ok um, what are some of your favorite family stories that include your parents, or siblings, or friends?

Shelly: Um, you want stories, um, uhh... I can tell ya my dad was known throughout the county as a jokester, a prankster, um he had his old ladies voice that he always make, call up people on the phone and pretend to be this old lady and even pretend to be their release society president or someone but he could always get someone going on the other end, um my mom, um, probably one of the funniest stories I remember on her was when on an Easter vacation we were out camping on the desert and this is not her personality that is why it was so funny, but some other friends that were out there drinking and got her into some drinking and she riding on the back of a dune buggy drunk and about fell off backwards where my brother had to pull her out of the dune buggy um, that is one of the funniest stories I remember on her, because she later became a relief society president, um my older brother, he was, he was just my older brother, he was a protector, he was always there, um I was teased a lot in jr. high because of my height and uh, he was in ninth grade when I was in seventh grade and uh, I remember one time being upset and one time him coming home upset because a certain kid was teasing me and the next day at school this kid thrown up against the wall, but um yeah, that was my older brother.

My younger sister was eight years younger than me and to me it was always a pain in my side because whatever Shawna wanted, Shawna got usually by bringing tears on, um so I got stuck baby sitting her a lot and if she cried and I wanted to go with friends and if she wanted to go with me, she would have to go with me and that's my sister, um I grew up in um Orangeville from the fifth grade on up and I had a best friend Darshanne Childs, we tended to hang around a lot, I have a lot of memories with her, um Orangeville was a small town and uh we weren't afraid in them days, kids in these days don't do this, we get on bikes and just going all over, um I remember riding our bikes over the old bridge that was here in Orangeville that was covered and um, riding our bikes up around the stock coral which is now gone, and playing there, um we used to roam the hills, and I have a lot of fond memories with her, um anyway, I don't know, what else do you want Heidi: Um, I don't know, what kind of things did you and Darshanne do?

Shelly: Ha-ha, depending on what age we were at depends on what we were doing, like I said when we were little kids it was just a lot of exploring and running around, we, we weren't the type that stayed in doors, we would be out doing our thing outside, um we did a lot of exploring which got us in trouble as we were down lower in the fields by the canal road where two other boys, I'm going to leave names out to protect the innocent ha-ha, but two other boys who we kind of hung around with came up one day and told us that there was some streakers down in this field camping, so we got really excited and we were going to go run down and spy on these streakers, we were probably about fifth grade, and we took off down here, down this road, across these fields and snuck back there and we were hiding behind some bushes when yeah, and we did run across a trailer that was out there camping and, um the lady was outside already nude, and was pregnant

and the guy came walking out the trailer and when he did, being the youthful people we were at the time we just started laughing, and that kind of gave away our position, and the guy went back in the trailer and got on his pants and chased us down, anyways that was really scary ha-ha the two boys ran faster than us two girls and they got away, but um he ended up catching up with us and gave us a good lecture, but um that was real scary, we seemed to get in trouble like that all the time, we didn't try but we did, um and then as we grew older we had, um jr. high was just jr. high, we had plenty of times where we got in trouble we were known as the motor mouths, we could talk, um and uh, if we were in a class together we never did very well, this one time at, I have a memory of, we were, we were in the old jr. high, it was before the new one was built, when I was in the ninth grade, we actually moved into the new jr. high which is the current one that the kids are now going to, but before then we were in the old jr. high which was located kind of where the Ferron elementary school is now and we actually had to share a lunch room with the elementary, we would go and eat and then we would go back to the main building for jr. high, and uh we were being chased from the lunch room to the main, to the main jr. high, Darshanne and I hurried and go through the doors and then the doors were the bar type that you pushed open, you had to push it open, and we were holding the bars so the boys couldn't get in, and between their tugging on the other side and us holding the bar, uh the door broke, the bars came off and, uh we just all took off running cause we knew we were in trouble but the principle at this time was known as, his name was doctor moron and he was mean and we were really scared of him, so we ran down to the girls shower room and hid, we were found and I remember having to write an essay that time on my proper conduct and how to act on school property.

Shelly: I'm supposed to be talking about more memories from jr. high if I can remember, um my seventh and eight grade year in jr. high we were at the old south emery jr. high and it was an older building, um there's a lot of memories there though, um one o which is um when we had gym girls showers and the boys shower were underneath the um stage in the theater, and um there was only a wall dividing the two so we would go down there to change our clothes to get into our P.E. cloths or we had a teacher that it was a necessity to shower before we got dressed, she would watch us shower and mark us off her chart and if we didn't shower we were docked for the day and boys had had defined art of learning how to drill holes through our um wall so they could watch us and one day when I came out of gym one of they boys that I was kind of liking at the time told me what color of underwear I was wearing so that kind of um got me going so the next day when we were in there changing clothes we could hear them behind the wall and we got cans of deodorant and we sprayed it through the holes in the wall, this deodorant, and low and behold this boy that come out told me what color of underwear I was wearing came out with a red eye that lasted a couple of days, it was way funny, and um I did have a friend through jr. high that was more like a sister to me, her name was Darshanne Childs, she didn't live too far from me, and we carried on, we had a lot of fun, and we used to get in trouble, we were always called the motor mouths, and had plenty of chalk thrown at us so that we would shut up and be quiet in class, there was a Mr. Nielsen that taught math and there's some boys in that class, and it would never fail, um there was a closet outside his room, and um every day after we got done with math class I was pushed in the closet and the door was shut and this one time I'm in there screaming, carrying on for somebody to get me out and the teacher had to come get me out which was kind of embarrassing, um I

don't know what to say, um there were, lets see, there was some good friend ships and some bad friend ships, there was some girls that I had a really hard time getting along with that didn't live far from me and I'm glad that I had Darshanne as a friend, we would always look out for each other, and we would hold ourselves with these other three that were always thinking they were better than us, um one thing I guess I remember looking forward to was after jr. high was high school and turning sixteen, um my birthday was in November, I was one of the first of my friends to get my drivers license which was way cool, I got to be the driver and drive everyone around, um that was a big wild storm, um the problem was trying to talk my parents into letting me take the car, um I had a really strict father that um I don't really think trusted me with the car and so when I did finally talk hours and hours and was able to take the car it was something really fun, this one time my parents were leaving for the weekend and I talked and talked and begged and begged if I could take the car to this dance in Ferron and they had finally agreed to let me take this car to the dance so Darshanne was going to come and sleep over and were going to go to the dance and we were going to just have this hay day of a night and um we ended up taking two other girls with us so there was four girls of us in the car and we went to this dance over in Ferron, and um Darshanne and I both ended up pairing off with two other boys that night and we were dancing with boys we both liked and the other two girls that were with us were bored and they came and asked me if they could take the car because they wanted to go down the road, they promised me they were just going down the road to visit a friend that wasn't too far from the jr. high, by this time this was a new jr. high that was built up in Ferron and after they begged me and begged me for quite a while to take the car I finally let them because Darshanne and I was having

fun at the dance and we and we stayed, well at the end of the dance I noticed that my car hadn't been returned and it had been hours, I started getting really extremely upset, well the boy that I was with, um he grabbed one of his friends that had a car, and um we all four got in the car and went around trying to find these two girls that had my car and by this time I was just in tears because I was thinking I was dead meat, my car was probably stolen, lost, wrecked, and um these girls didn't even have a license and I knew I was in big trouble, so by the time we got back to the jr. high they were there with my car and waiting and I was so mad, I don't think I ever yelled at somebody, at that point in my life I don't think I ever lost my temper like I did with them two that night and they didn't even speak to me all the way home in fact they didn't speak to me for a couple of months because I think they were afraid of, they knew they were wrong and they were afraid that I was still mad at them but I did forgive and forget, one time Darshanne and I went on a, we asked boys out for a all girls choice dance, and I asked a kid out from Ferron that I had a major crush on and she asked a kid out in Huntington that she had a major crush on and so once again I was the only one with a drivers license, even out of the boys, I was the only one with a drivers license so I was the one driving, there was a major issue here, her date was clear in Huntington and my date was clear in Ferron, and the dance was at the high school and my mom and dad had a curfew, I had to be home by midnight, if I wasn't home by midnight there was heck to pay so we leave and at this time the road that you now know that goes out of Orangeville and it goes down to the highway and turns off to Ferron, it was just being redone and rebuilt and so it was not being used at that time, um we'd go up to the dance and we would pick up our dates, I go to Ferron to pick up my date, we go to Huntington to pick up Darshannes' date, go to the dance, we have a really

good time and then we went back to Huntington to this other kids house and play pool, take pool and some games and its like ten minutes to my curfew and I am still in Huntington and I've got to return to Ferron, so we dropped off Darshannes' date and we were all sitting in the car and we waited to see if she was going to give him a kiss goodnight and she didn't and we all get back in the car and we were leaving and we're going as fast as I dare go to get to Ferron, we get to Ferron, and um there was Darshanne and another girl in the car, I go to walk my date up to the door, and he plants one on me and embarrasses me cause I have to go back to the car and get, what's the word teased by the friends, by this time I am really extremely late, as I'm driving home from, I'm thinking ya know if I take that turnoff instead of driving clear to Castle Dale and going clear around its going to save me a lot of time and like I said the road was under construction and I knew it was getting near completion but I didn't know how near so I chanced it, so I took the road and I'm in my mom and dads brand new Monty Carlo car and this road is, got like, and they were pavement, so there was like levels of pavement, and we would go up and down and up and down and it was really bad and so finally when I get to Orangeville and got the car home I was thinking I was in big trouble but it wasn't as bad as what I had been, or what I thought I was going to be in because I had called. Darshanne and I were setting each other up on dates all the time, at this time I had a boyfriend from Orangeville that I was dating, and she was dating this guy from Price, so this one weekend, I don't know how me managed it, but we managed it, we had set up, or I had her set up with my date and his best friend and we were going up to the mountains and picnicking and carrying on the mountains often on Saturday and then we were coming home and she had it arranged for that night that we were coming and she

had it arranged for that night that we were going out with her boyfriend from price and with his best buddy and we were going out to the movies but see neither on of them knew about it

Heidi: Gol, you guys are players

Shelly: We got to go, this, this was bad because, so we go up to the mountains, and um it was date because I like the mountains, and we just, we would, we would, um we would four wheeler around, we stopped and cooked hot dogs and just messed around and goofed off and we had fun, and then we came back, and um, and our date, you know my date, they dropped us off, well um I don't know how it got out, but it got out, and back in them days and it may even be, I don't even know now, but back in them days there was this big issue about carbon boys coming over to emery and dating emery girls and if carbon boys found out about it, I mean if emery boys found out about it then there was big trouble, so I don't know what happened but somehow word got out about it to my boyfriend in Orangeville that um, I was going out with this guy from Price, and he and his friends happened to meet them two um coming into Orangeville, they had a truck, a bunch of trucks at the turnoff, the Orangeville turnoff waiting for them, and so when they tried to come into Orangeville they were chased out, so basically that turned into a disaster that night, um because then I had him extremely mad at me and I'm not saying names and um he was going up and down my street ninety miles per hour and got the cops called on him, and um I ended up being woke to his friend pounding on my bedroom window and my sister was in bed with me, and it scared her so she goes in and wakes up my dad and tells him that there is someone at the window trying to kidnap us so he comes running in and there at the window, it was just an all ugly thing, that's one of the times that dating

got me in big trouble, um oh and what's interesting now is that how I still live in Orangeville and emery county is and half of these guys I dated, I still, I still run into them and its just kind of weird, but um one of them I work with at Emery Telecom and we even joked about our kiss we had that night at his door step, so during this time when I was a sophomore and my brother was a senior, and um that was, that was really weird to me, cause I had a couple of classes with my brother, and um I remember in my science class we were seated in alphabetical order so we happened to sit by each other, and um that was just kind of different really and I remember we would get home and then we would have fights over who was going to do what with the homework, um Wade was dating steadily at this time, Lisa Siterude, and when they graduated they got married a year later, and um my junior year, um I think it was the summer of my junior year, Darshanne met Gordon Bennett and started seriously dating him, and um because we had been such close friends, that when she started seriously dating him, and I didn't have a steady boyfriend they would pick me up all the time and take me with them, and stuff, and that became kind of awkward, then Gordon turned in his mission papers and left on a mission, and my senior year I was dating this other kid and, and had been for a while, and a, and we had been on an on and off thing ever since elementary school with this kid, we had a dating history, and a this one time I'm at a mutual activity and they were showing movies, and this boyfriend of mine brings this guy to the activity with him, and introduces him to me, and his name is Michael Scow and he is this returned missionary, and this was like January of my Senior Year, and um, I didn't think too much about it, I just thought, oh he's a cute returned missionary, didn't think that much about it, and um one day when I was walking home from, I was walking up the street, he pulls up in his

old blue Chevy truck, he got this blue Chevy truck that he could just barely afford when he got off of his mission, and asked me if I wanted a ride home so, I got in the truck and he took me home, and um a couple weeks later I was gone to a church function on a Saturday and we were having a laurels conference and when I got home my mom informed me that this Mike guy had been to the door asking for me, and I was like, um it must have been that Michael Scow, that returned missionary, and so he came over again that night and it just so happened that I was baby sitting for some people and he wanted me to go out and do something with him, and it just so happened that I was babysitting, and I called up that lady that I was babysitting for, and I asked her if it was ok if he came over with me and babysat and he came over with me and we babysat together that night, and um that was basically the first date of my future husband I guess you could say

Heidi: That's kind of sad.

Shelly: But what babysitting (ha-ha) he was broke, he was broke, the poor guy couldn't even afford anything to live in, he was living in his dads trailer down at that trailer park where Jesse's brother used to live, he was living in a camp trailer, and I was just living up the street and we started seeing each other really a lot, and this other boy I was dating, he

Heidi: You're a player.

Shelly: He was um, no he was a player, he was playing me too, that's why I didn't feel bad about playing Mike, at the same time I was dating him because at the time he was dating this other girl at the same time he was dating me so that didn't bother me at all, and in fact it was like ha-ha, you know.

Heidi: In your face.

Shelly: What fair game, what goes around comes around, so I was like it didn't even matter to me you know, I had really liked him and he had hurt me a lot before, and I was sick of being hurt, he though, one night when I was with Mike, he told me you know, I haven't dated anyone since I got off my mission and I know I think I need to see other girls too, and such and such, and I thought oh this is the blow off, so um when he started talking about dating other people I was like ok so this kid I had been dating asked me out to the valentines dance the next week of school and I just had said yes because of what Mike had told me about wanting to date other people, so I told him yes, and mike happened to come up to my house that night and wanted to do things and wanted to play games and stuff and we were playing battle ship at my house and I happened to mention that I had a date and he got mad and I think he was hurt and he left and so I was like this guy is weird, he tells me he wants to date other people and then I get a date and now he's mad and so, I kind of wait the options at that point, um because of a kid I had been dating, of what he had put me through already, vs. Mike who was really sweet and innocent at the time (ha-ha).

Heidi: Yeah (cough).

Shelly: (ha-ha) He was a very sweet guy.

Heidi: That's gone.

Shelly: He was a very sweet guy and he treated me very good, he had some things that I was looking for that I wasn't seeing in any other people, mainly things that were important to me, was um, was a testimony of the church and somebody that wanted to be active in the church, I was basically in a inactive home, but my religion still became important to me at this time in my life, because of the influences in my life like

Darshanne and other people and my friends and other people around me that had made it important, my brother had gotten married in the temple a year before with Lisa, and we had gone there and I had just wanted the same thing myself, so when I looked at what both of them could really really offer, and I finally went to Burt the next day, I wasn't going to say names, went to him the next day at school and told him that I couldn't go to the dance that I had accepted a babysitting job that was over the weekend and I was going to make me a lot of money, and I couldn't go with him, so I broke off the date and then when Mike came up to my house, I called him up and he came up and I told him that I broke off the date, and that was the first time he told me he loved me and he never said anything about dating anyone else again (ha-ha) um it wasn't soon after that I think he was the first person who told me he loved me and cried at the same time.

Heidi: He cried?

Shelly: Mmmm Hmmm

Heidi: On the phone?

Shelly: No when he was telling me, he cried, he got tears in his eyes, so um.

Heidi: Has anyone ever told you they loved you before?

Shelly: Mmmm Hmmm, yes.

Heidi: The kid that drove ninety miles per hour?

Shelly: Yes, he was going to drive his cliff off of a cliff and kill himself too.

Heidi: That's not good.

Shelly: (ha-ha)

Heidi: That can't be healthy.

Shelly: (ha-ha) Boys get a little weird when you do juristic things to them

Heidi: I agree.

Shelly: (ha-ha) So don't try and threaten to break things off with them when they are in that kind of a mood, ok so things were getting pretty

Heidi: Wa wa wa wait, did you tell him that you loved him too?

Shelly: I Cant remember what I did, I remember him telling me that and I remember him getting tears in his eyes when he told me that, and I think I did, I think I told him I loved him too, but um, it was a month later, well it was because, like I said it was at the valentines dance when I broke up that dance with what's his name.

Heidi: That one kid.

Shelly: (ha-ha) And then, and then mike asked me to marry him on Valentines Day.

Heidi: What that was fast.

Shelly: So instead of going to the dance he spent up, I ended up, I still had a lot of babysitting, I really did, I did a lot of babysitting, I was babysitting and I also worked down on main street at the pharmacy there, convert pharmacy, you may remember it, some people in the olden days may remember that, its where T.C. west is now, that t-shirt store, it used to be a pharmacy and I would work there, and I had a job there, I did a lot of babysitting for people that, and I was babysitting that weekend, overnight for a couple that was gone, so mike had came up to help me, so when he came up and asked me to marry him.

Heidi: Where did he ask you to marry him?

Shelly: It was before I left to go babysitting, because I remember we were lying in the living room on my couch and he turned to me and said these words, "You know I want to marry you".

Heidi: And what did you say?

Shelly: and I just said, um this is something that I have to pray and fast about (ha-ha), and I think that kind of blew him off, he's like "yeah ok (ha-ha)" its cause I, I didn't know if I was ready for a marriage proposal or not yet, so I went babysitting that weekend, and when he would come and see and then finally when the weekend was up I told him I would, but then I was just a senior in high school and I don't want you getting any ideas in your head.

Heidi: Go on.

Shelly: I don't want you (ha-ha) my mom wasn't very happy about it because she wanted me to graduate from high school before I moved on to marriage, and Mike wanted to get married right away, and but, my mom got her way, of course the moms always do.

Heidi: Obviously!

Shelly: (ha-ha) And so we got married in June, two weeks after I graduated high school, and its not that I regret marriage, or regret having my children, but as I look back on things now, I wish I had time, I would have had time to grow up more, cause I don't think I had a chance to grow up even after I got married, so I went from being a teenager in my mom and dads home to moving into a home being run by a husband, and I don't think I really had time to go out and find me, and I became pregnant right off the bat, and I wish I could have had that time, I think that's important to be able to have that time to be able to find you, and you and what you want to be and for, and anyways, I wont lecture about that, but that's that.

Heidi: You're just saying that because I'm single dating, this is history, not whatever you think this is.

Shelly: (ha-ha) You do what you want, you always.

Heidi: Mom, you can't do this, this is history.

Shelly: (ha-ha)

Heidi: Quit it.

Shelly: What else do you want to know?

Heidi: Ready.

Shelly: Bank robber then occurred, I told you about this pharmacy I worked in, I worked there from my sophomore to my senior year, and I believe it was about my junior year, I'm working there, and I worked about three or four nights after school, and then I would work every other Saturday, and I think it was one of the nights after school when we were there working, and um, when all the sudden cops were all over and they were shutting every business down in Castle Dale, and um they shut the banks down, and they shut the pharmacy and the stores down, and they informed us that there had been a bank robbery in Huntington, and they were still trying to get them and they were at large and they were shutting down all the roads and making road blocks so they could catch their crooks before they left, because they had shot two ladies at a Zion bank in Huntington, and I found out later that um that they had indeed shot two ladies and they were killed which was something for emery county, which was something that didn't happen, so it just really kind of, you know it just kind of really.

Heidi: Did you know the ladies?

Shelly: No, I, I knew ones little sister, I went to school with her, and it was her big sister that died, and I remember that, and going to school with her, and I remember later on going to a fireside where her father talked, and he was talking on forgiveness because this

guy was evil, um he was just, he was just, when they, when they were in jail there was comments maybe about how he was just bad.

Heidi: Who?

Shelly: This guy that did the bank robbery.

Heidi: Oh.

Shelly: And they did end up catching them, the road blocks didn't let them through they ended up getting em, and the one girl was just a newly wed. and this is the one that I knew her sister, they had just gotten married, they hadn't been married that long and she was shot and killed the day that she was working, like I said I can remember a few months, oh probably six or eight months after it happened, maybe a year even after it happened we had a fireside with her dad, where her dad actually talked, or maybe it was, maybe it was another member of the family I cant remember, but they were talking about how, on the miracle of forgiveness, and how he the father was able to go up there and tell the guy that he had forgiven him for killing his daughter, so yeah
