Adeline Leonard Wakefield Starr 1908 ~ 2004 "An Elect Lady" Adeline Leonard Wakefield Starr, 95, passed away peacefully at home on 5 February, 2004. Born 11 August, 1908, in Huntington, UT, to John H. and Alice Leonard. She was Valedictorian at Huntington High School, 1927. Adeline married Perry P. Wakefield 5 December, 1933, in the Manti Temple. He died 24 April, 1965.

She married William Starr 24 May, 1969. He died 21 December, 1987. Adeline was County Chairman of the American Cancer Society for 10 years, President YWMIA, President Relief Society, teacher and active member of the LDS Church all her life. She loved traveling, writing, reading, sewing -- she sent numerous articles to the Utah State Fair every year since 1921, winning hundreds of ribbons and prizes. Due to her many accomplishments she has been the subject of articles and features in many newspapers and periodicals and has chronicled her own life of 95 years in several volumes. She is survived by six sons: Gregg (Eldyth), Price, UT; Garth (Kay Lynn), Salt Lake City, UT; Shelton (Sharon), Houston, TX; Wendell (Lynette), Roswell, NM; Lond (Valene), Huntington, UT; Preston (Becky), Salt Lake City, UT; one daughter, Jerilyn Wakefield, Stansbury Park, UT; one brother, Lund Leonard, Ferron, UT; 22 grandchildren, 39 great-grandchildren and two great-great-grandchildren. Government pay high in Utah

Direct increases to salaried government employees in Utah for the past year are the highest in the nation, according to a study by the Franklin Institute, Philadelphia, Pa. The study shows that Utah's average annual per capita personal income rose by \$25 million in 1943, or 11.5 percent, over 1942. This compares with a 7.2 percent increase for the U. S. as a whole.

The Franklin report shows that Utah's personal income per capita rose from \$225 in 1942 to \$250 in 1943. This is 11.5 percent higher than the U. S. average of \$231, or 11.5 percent. Utah ranks 24th among the states in the per capita income race. Twelve of the 17 states making up the nation are increasing their per capita income more than Utah. The study shows that Utah's per capita income is 5.8 percent higher than the national average of \$231, or 11.5 percent.
